Methodology

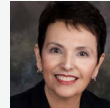
PRE-FORUM

Pre-work, interview, online survey

DURING FORUM

- **Learn** – sharing of information on each topic
- **Practice** – practicing through role plays during the session
- **Apply** – planning for and conducting real-life application exercises of the skill or behavior
- **Develop Others** – sharing the new learning, skill or behavior with others
- **Assess** – incorporating accountability opportunities for self-assessment and coaching
- **Explore Further** – tools, articles, and action plans to continue the practice and improvement
